It was decided that the Arizona Cancer Control Program will be the lead agency to roll this out. Kendra &amp; Fred also talked with Banner &amp; MD Anderson and they are ready to take this on and move forward. November this will be rolled out and introduced to the public in the hopes that it will spread throughout the business community and get them involved.</p> <p>There was a little bit of discussion surrounding one of the five pillars to this Gold Standard &gt;&gt; Prevention, Screening &amp; Early Detection. Several of the committee members believed that the screening guidelines should be readdressed, especially for prostate and breast cancers. Recently there has been much debate surrounding the best practices for screening of these two cancer types. <p>Cornelia Todecozy</p>	<p>Environmental Cancer Compensation Program -  <i>On October 5, 1990, Congress passed the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act ("RECA" or "the Act"), 42 U.S.C. § 2210 note, providing compassionate payments to individuals who contracted certain cancers/diseases as a result of their exposure to radiation during the above-ground nuclear weapons tests or as a result of their exposure to radiation as uranium workers.</i></p> <p><b>Northern Arizona RESEP</b> (Radiation Exposure Screening &amp; Education Program) through <b>North Country HealthCare</b> is set up to educate the public concerning the effects of nuclear radiation due to nuclear fallout or nuclear materials such as uranium, by providing no cost medical screenings and assistance in filing RECA claims.
