AHCCCS Strategic Plan

- STRATEGY #1: Enhance Harm Reduction Strategies to Prevent Overdose
 - GOAL #1: Provide education and training on Naloxone to prescribers, pharmacists and AHCCCS members
 - GOAL #2: Increase member access to Naloxone.



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- STRATEGY #2: Promote responsible prescribing and dispensing policies and practices
 - GOAL #1: Reduce the number of opioid-naïve AHCCCS members unnecessarily started on opioid treatment
 - GOAL #2: Improve care processes for chronic pain and high-risk AHCCCS members.



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- STRATEGY #3: Enhance Access to Medication Assisted Treatment
 - GOAL #1: Assess statewide capacity of MAT providers available to AHCCCS members
 - GOAL #2: Increase access to integrated MAT for AHCCCS members



Reverse Overdoses Through Naloxone

- Community distribution of Naloxone
 - ~4,600 kits, 305 reversals





Governor's Executive Order

- Limit on opioid prescriptions to 7 days
 - Adults first fill
 - All children's
 - Includes specified exemptions
- Stakeholder engagement
- Implementing 4/1



STR Grant Strategies

- Comprehensive needs assessment, state strategic plan, monitoring initiative
- Prevention activities, including law enforcement naloxone distribution, GOYFF activities
- Improving access to MAT, including provider education, peer support services, Centers of Excellence, post-discharge coordinated care, enhanced treatment activities
- Coordinate Medicaid strategies
