Medical Marijuana Testing Advisory Council: Findings and Recommendations

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1.0 Council Background

1.1 Council Duties

This report encompasses the work of the Medical Marijuana Testing Advisory Council (Council), convened pursuant to A.R.S. 36-2821 to advise the Director of the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) regarding the administration and implementation of a required medical marijuana testing program. On an annual basis, the Council is charged with reviewing the marijuana testing programs and submitting a report that includes the following:

- An assessment of whether an analyte should be removed from the required testing panel;
- Information about testing-related statements of deficiency and remediation efforts for medical marijuana dispensaries, Independent third-party laboratories, marijuana establishments, and marijuana testing facilities; and,
- Any other recommendations on improving the testing programs.

1.2 Council Membership

In accordance with A.R.S. 36-2821, the Council is comprised of the following members (named list is available in Appendix 1), appointed by the ADHS Director and chaired by the Director's designee:

- 1. The president or executive director of a statewide nonprofit association representing the marijuana dispensaries, or the person's designee.
- 2. The president or executive director of a statewide nonprofit cannabis testing association, or the person's designee.
- 3. The president or executive director of a medical marijuana trade association that does not primarily consist of dispensaries or cannabis laboratory testing facility owners, or the person's designee.
- 4. A representative of a nonprofit medical marijuana dispensary who is employed by the dispensary to cultivate medical marijuana and who has at least three years of medical marijuana cultivation experience.
- 5. A representative of an Arizona-based nonprofit medical marijuana dispensary that produces medical marijuana concentrates and that has been regularly sending products for testing who has at least three years of medical marijuana extraction experience.
- 6. A representative of an Arizona-based nonprofit medical marijuana dispensary that is primarily focused on producing medical marijuana edibles who has at least three years of medical marijuana edible production experience.
- 7. An owner of an Arizona-based cannabis testing laboratory.
- 8. A laboratory scientist who holds a doctorate or a bachelor of science degree and who has at least three years of experience in cannabis laboratory testing.
- 9. A registered qualifying patient.
- 10. A registered designated caregiver.
- 11. A representative of the department of public safety.

- 12. A licensed health care provider who specializes in treating substance use disorders and who has at least five years of experience.
- 13. One university faculty member from each university under the jurisdiction of the Arizona Board of Regents who has an academic appointment in the chemistry department or another related analytical lab testing area to function as independent subject matter experts.
- 14. A representative of a laboratory that conducts proficiency testing for laboratories in this state.

1.3 Record of Business

The Council prepared agendas and kept a record of each meeting through complete meeting recordings in compliance with Arizona's Open Meeting Law (A.R.S. Title 38, Chapter 3, Article 3.1). A <u>Council website</u>¹ was developed to serve as a repository for all information reviewed, presented, and discussed. Agendas and meeting recordings are included on the Council website. Two meetings were held in 2021 - one each in November and December.

2.0 Council Recommendations

2.1 Removal of Analytes from the Testing Panel

The Council recommends the following analytes should be removed from the required testing panel:

- Pesticides
 - Acequinocyl
 - DDVP (Dichlorvos) NOTE: The Council recommends that laboratories monitor and report back to the state all DDVP detections.
 - Cinerin 1 (in the Pyrethrin category)
 - Jasmolin 1 (in the Pyrethrin category)
- Solvents
 - Propane

2.2 Other Recommendations for Improving the Testing Programs

Pursuant to A.R.S 36-2812 (C)(3), Council members may include in this report other recommendations for improving the testing programs. The following are the Council's additional 2021 recommendations:

- ADHS should align the required testing rules between the medical and adult use marijuana testing programs.
- ADHS should develop a transparent, clear, and standardized process for issuing marijuana product recalls.
- A future MMTAC meeting should include a discussion of requirements for a standardized certificate of analysis that includes expiration dates on the test results provided.
- There should be an improved and standardized procedure for edits to certificates of analysis and how these amended reports are reported to clients and patients.
- Beginning in 2022, ADHS should meet at least quarterly with medical marijuana testing program stakeholders.
 - Topics of stakeholder meetings with ADHS could include items such as compounds to monitor for testing or removal from the testing panel; specific items within the Arizona Administrative Code such as batch definitions; items for inclusion on certificates of analysis; technical laboratory procedures; and the product recall process.

3.0 Testing-Related Deficiencies and Remediation*

3.1 Medical Marijuana Dispensaries and Marijuana Establishments

Between May 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021, a total of 77 testing-related statements of deficiency comprising 178 citations were issued to 73 licensees (29 medical marijuana dispensaries and 44 marijuana establishments). Plans of correction were submitted to and accepted by ADHS for each of the statements of Deficiency. Appendix 2 provides a deidentified listing of the dispensary and establishment testing-related statements of deficiency and remediation.*

3.2 Independent Third-Party Laboratories and Testing Facilities

Between November 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021, a total of 49 testing-related reports of finding comprising 1,378 violations were issued to 18 independent third-party laboratories and testing facilities. Remediation actions included:

- 36 corrective action plans submitted and accepted by ADHS
- 1 consent agreement for withdrawal of applications for testing
- 1 notice of intent to revoke a laboratory registration certificate was issued
- 2 notices of intent to assess civil money penalties issued
- 7 ADHS actions still in progress.

Appendix 3 provides a deidentified listing of laboratory and testing facility inspection reports and corrective actions.*
