THE ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES has found, under the authority of A.R.S. § 36-2232 et seq and Pursuant to Department of Health Services rules, that public necessity requires the operation of

LIFE LINE AMBULANCE SERVICE, INC.

as a ground ALS and BLS ambulance service in the State of Arizona for the transportation of individuals who are sick, injured, wounded or otherwise incapacitated or helpless within the following service area, with the following central operations station and response times:

1. Service Area:

- a. *City of Prescott and the area encompassed by the following points: Starting at Iron Springs Road west to Hillside on state route 96 to milepost 22, including the communities of Highland Pines, Skull Valley, Kirkland, and Hillside; travel north to the point of Campwood, including Campwood, Williamson Valley Road and the community of Simmons; travel northeast to the point of the Drake Railroad Overpass on U.S. Alternative Highway 89, including the communities of Paulden, Chino Valley; travel southeast to the point of milepost 340 on U.S. Highway 89A; travel south to the point of the intersection of U.S. Highway 169 and Interstate 17 including the community of Cherry; travel south to the point of the intersection of U.S. Highway 69 and Interstate 17 including the communities and towns of Diamond Valley, Prescott Valley, Prescott Country Club, Dewey, Humboldt, Mayer, Spring Valley; travel west to the point of Goodwin on Senator Highway (35 miles from Prescott) including the communities of Groom Creek, Walker and Goodwin; travel south to milepost 11 on SR-74 then travel southwest on U.S. 60 to milepost 138, including the towns of Yarnell, Congress, Peoples Valley, Wickenburg, Wittmann, Morristown, Circle City and Aguila, then travel west to U.S. 60 milepost 75, the Maricopa/La Paz county line; then travel north along the La Paz county line to Yavapai county until*

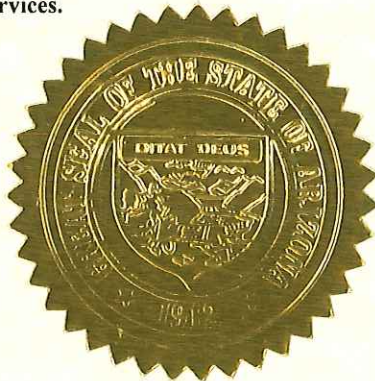
Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in the Arizona Department of Health Services, under the constitution and laws of the State of Arizona, does hereby grant this

authorizing the operation of the aforesaid ambulance service for a period ending September 30, 2024 unless for cause sooner amended, suspended, revoked or terminated subject to the decisions and orders, and rules of the Department.

PROVIDED, that this certificate shall not be assigned nor transferred unless authorized by the Arizona Department of Health Services.

the La Paz county line intersects with the Santa Maria River, then east along the Santa Maria River to U.S. 93 milepost 160 (Santa Maria Bridge); then west to the starting point west to Hillside, to state route 96 to milepost 22.

b. Excluding the legal boundaries of the Town of Peoria as of the date of October 25, 2004.

c. Excluding the Town of Buckeye.

d. Excluding interfacility, convalescent transfers within U.S. 60 milepost 138, north to SR-74 milepost 11, north to Maricopa county line, west one mile and then back south to SR-74 milepost 10, then southeast to milepost 138 on U.S. 60 to the starting point.

e. Excluding the legal boundaries of the City of Surprise as of the date of October 25, 2004.

f. Starting at State Highway 89 milepost marker 348 (Drake Railroad Overpass) southwest to Campwood, then travel northwest to Interstate 40 milepost marker 109; travel to a point on the Hualapai Indian Reservation that is approximately 33.5 miles northeast of the intersection of the Hualapai Indian Reservation and Yavapai/Mohave county line, following this border east to the Grand Canyon National Park; continue east to State Highway 64, travel southeast to US Highway 180 milepost 252, travel south to Interstate 40 milepost 178, then travel due south to the Coconino/Yavapai county line, southwest to State Highway 89A milepost 340, then northwest to beginning at State Highway 89 milepost 348. Including the communities of Williams, Parks, Valle, Ash Fork, Seligman, Tusayan and transfers from the Grand Canyon National Parks Clinic.

g. Beginning at Milepost 161 on US Hwy 93, approximately N34°22'04.18" W113°10'47.29," then East/Northeast to the point just South of Hillside at approximately N34°24'43.30" W112°53'33.61," then Northeast to the Yava Bridge crossing at Kirkland Creek, approximately N34°28'23.84" W112°53'18.52" to include the Town of Hillside and State Hwy 96/County Road 15 between the Yava

Bridge and the Town of Hillside, then Northwest to the intersection of Lindahl Rd. and Sunburst Dr. at approximately N34°36'10.33" W113°08'29.54" to include all of the Sycamore Mobile Home Park, then West to a point where Boulder Creek and Niagra Creek join approximately N34°36'24.92" W113°13'52.80," then Southwest to the Mohave/Yavapai County line on US Hwy 93 at approximately N34°28'41.86" W113°19'56.41," then Southwest along US Hwy 93 back to the point of origin at Milepost 161 on US Hwy 93.

3. Response Times:

a. Prescott/Prescot Valley:

- 1) Ten (10) minutes on eighty (80) percent of all emergency calls.*
- 2) Twelve (12) minutes on ninety (90) percent of all emergency calls.*
- 3) Fifteen (15) minutes on ninety-five (95) percent of all emergency calls.*
- 4) Thirty (30) minutes on ninety-eight (98) percent of all emergency calls.*

b. Other Cities and Towns with sub operation stations:

- 1) Ten (10) minutes on seventy (70) percent of all emergency call.*
- 2) Fifteen (15) minutes on ninety (90) percent of all emergency calls.*
- 3) Thirty (30) minutes on ninety-eight (98) percent of all emergency calls.*

c. Remainder of C.O.N. 62:

- 1) Thirty (30) minutes on seventy-five (75) percent of all emergency calls.*
- 2) Sixty (60) minutes on ninety-five (95) percent of all emergency calls.*
- 3) Ninety (90) minutes on ninety-eight (98) percent of all emergency calls.*

4. Type of Service: *Immediate response transports, interfacility and convalescent transports.*

5. Hours of Operation: *24 hours per day – 7 days per week*
