## Table 2: Agents Eligible for Administration During a Hazardous Material Incident

EMCT's are authorized to administer, and monitor medications through their administrative medical director's delegated authority during a Hazardous Materials Incident. The Medical Direction Commission periodically reviews the following list of medications and will make recommendations for changes that the Director of the Arizona Department of Health Services must then approve.

The following list represents the most recent iteration of the Director approved hazardous materials incident medication list. Administrative Medical Directors may authorize EMCTs operating under their delegated medical authority during a hazardous materials incident to administer any or all of the medications from this list.

**<u>KEY:</u>** = Minimum supply required if an EMS provider chooses to make the optional agent available for Paramedic administration.

Pralidoxime (Protopam®)	Optional [as determined by administrative medical director]

Sodium chloride 0.9%	Optional [as determined by administrative medical director]
Sodium nitrite and sodium thiosulfate (NITHIODOTE®)	Optional [as determined by administrative medical director]
Tetracaine	Optional [as determined by administrative medical director]
