

# Use Vaccine Information on the Box

(not the vaccine information on the vial or syringe)

The Arizona VFC standard is to always use the vaccine information (Lot #, Manufacturer, Expiration date, NDC) found on the box when recording administered doses in patient's charts or in their ASIIS record.

Pictured below are the vaccines currently known to the Arizona VFC program, to have conflicting vaccine information from the vial or syringe than the box.

**BE CAUTIOUS!** Remember to always store vaccine in the original packaging and use the vaccine information on the most outer box.

## Menveo | Meningococcal (MCV4O) | GSK



\*Diluent for Menveo must be stored with vaccine in original packaging within fridge

## Rotarix | Rotavirus RV1 | GSK



\*Diluent for Rotarix should be stored with vaccine in original packaging within fridge

## Pentacel | DTaP-Hib-IPV | Sanofi



\*All Pentacel components must be stored in original packaging within fridge

## Prevnar 13 | PCV-13 | Pfizer



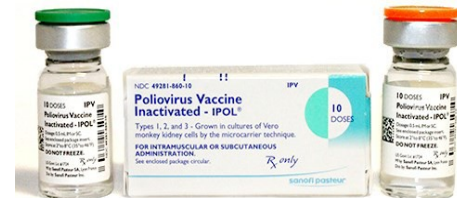
\*Pprevnar 13 does not have a diluent but can have a different manufacturer on the syringe than the box, store vaccine in original packaging within fridge

## Act-HIB | Haemophilus Type b Conjugate | Sanofi



\*Diluent for Act-HIB must be stored with vaccine in original packaging within fridge

## IPOL | Inactivated Polio | Sanofi



\*IPOL does not have a diluent but can have a different lot number on the vial than the box, store vaccine in original packaging within fridge
