STATE OF ARIZONA PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, falls have become the leading cause of unintentional injury in Arizona with the largest rate occurring among age 64 and older; and

WHEREAS, 1 in 3 older adults will fall, and more than 5,500 older Arizonans were hospitalized for a hip fracture (nearly half of all fall-related hospitalizations); and

WHEREAS, falls are the leading cause of unintentional injury-related deaths among those 65 and older, injury-related hospitalizations and emergency department visits among older adults; and

WHEREAS, falling is NOT an inevitable result of aging; and

WHEREAS, all of us have the power to reduce the risk of falling.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Douglas A. Ducey, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim September 2016 as

FALLS PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH

in Arizona and urge all older adults, family members and caregivers, health care providers, fire and medical departments, first responders and concerned citizens to join the Arizona Falls Prevention Coalition in raising awareness of falls prevention and working together to reduce falls through increased physical activity, and community partnerships to promote Falls Free Arizona.
